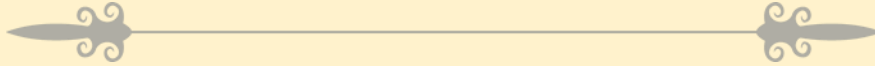




6 Nights Scheduled Safari Kasane to Maun



Highlights

2 nights Moremi / Khwai Mokoro excursion

2 nights Savuti in Chobe National Park

2 nights Chobe Floodplain in Chobe National Park

River cruise on the Chobe River

PRICE INCLUDES:

Camping equipment (spacious bow tents with camp bed and full bedding with ensuite bush ablutions), all transfers and activities as per the itinerary, all meals that are indicated (B – breakfast, L – lunch, D – dinner), filtered drinking water, tea/coffees, soft drinks, local alcohols, mineral water, services of a Professional Guide, Camp Chef and an Assistant, all Botswana park fees for activities included on itinerary and transport in specialised safari vehicles.

DOES NOT INCLUDE:

Covid-19 PCR test fees (please note your travel insurance must cover for COVID-19). Visas, airport transfers, tips, curios, optional excursions, Insurance to cover for cancellation and curtailment, medical, baggage, emergency evacuation, any increase in National Park fees.



DAY 1: CHOBE FLOODPLAIN - CHOBE NATIONAL PARK

Arriving in Kasane, an extraordinary cruise on the Chobe River awaits you. The meeting point is at Kalahari Tours, Kasane at 12h30 before embarking on the boat cruise at around 14h00. This amazing experience allows you to get a closer look at the aquatic animals and birds not easily approached on safari. The cruise is also a great icebreaker where everyone on the safari gets to know one another. After the boat cruise, Chobe National Park awaits. A leisurely game drive to your camp will give great opportunities for amazing views of the sun setting over the Chobe River floodplain. You will arrive at camp just before dark, where the rest of the safari team will welcome you to your home for the next 2 nights. Camping will be in private designated campsites with ensuite bush ablutions on each tent. (L,D)

Kasane – Chobe camp: 30km, 1,5h



DAY 2: CHOBE FLOODPLAIN - CHOBE NATIONAL PARK

The next day, your morning and afternoon game drives will meander along the banks of the river, followed by the call of the majestic African Fish Eagle. The Chobe River Floodplain is an amazing game viewing area where water attracts large herds of buffalo, elephant, zebra and other herbivores. Due to the proliferation of prey, predators are likely to be close at hand. (B,L,D)



DAY 3: SAVUTI/ZWEZWE - CHOBE NATIONAL PARK

Today we head south, away from the Chobe River, further into the heart of Chobe National Park. As you continue your search for wildlife, you will traverse the drier region of Savuti where bull elephants dot the plains. Savuti is very well known for its predators such as lion, leopard, cheetah and even African wild dog. Camping will be in private designated campsites with ensuite bush ablutions on each tent. (B,L,D)

Chobe River – Savuti: 170 km, 5h

DAY 4: SAVUTI/ZWEZWE - CHOBE NATIONAL PARK

Game drives to explore Southern Chobe National Park (Savute / ZweiZwei). (B,L,D)



DAY 5: MOREMI / KHWAI

From Savuti you will drive through to Moremi / Khwai, one of the best wilderness areas of Botswana which covers swamp and dry areas. The next two days will be spent searching for the wide variety of wildlife and birds that this area is renowned for, while absorbing the sounds and beauty of this region. Game drives in the early morning as the sun rises and in the late afternoon as the sun sets will be the norm. Camping will be in private designated campsites with ensuite bush ablutions on each tent. (B,L,D)

Savuti – Moremi / Khwai: 120km. 5-6h



DAY 6: MOREMI / KHWAI

Game drives to explore the region surrounding the Khwai river (North-east Moremi / Khwai Concession). A mokoro excursion will take you along a tributary of the Khwai River to view game from another perspective and to experience this tranquil mode of transport. (B,L,D)



DAYS 7: MAUN

Leaving early on day 7, a game drive out of Moremi / Khwai will be our last opportunity to see the more elusive animals not yet spotted. We continue to Maun arriving at around 12h00, where we will drop you off at your lodge or at the airport. We are happy to arrange post-tour accommodation and activities at an additional cost. (B)

Moremi / Khwai - Maun: 150km, 5h (including game drive)



DESCRIPTION

Camping safari where all camp chores are carried out by our teams. There is always one guide with the guests and a backup team (chef + camp assistants) in a backup vehicle setting up and breaking camps, cooking meals, etc.

EQUIPMENT

Very spacious tents (3m x 3m x 1.95m) with bedrolls and bedding included and ensuite private bush ablutions (shower, toilet, toiletry stand) with direct access from the tent. All drinks included (soft, local alcoholic drinks, still water).

VEHICLE

4x4 safari vehicles custom-built - custom built trailers - one backup vehicle specifically dedicated to setting up/packing the camp.

NUMBER OF GUESTS

Maximum participants = 9 pax so that everyone gets a window seat. Departure is guaranteed as soon as we have confirmed 1 guest Check out the following page ([link to Fully Serviced page](#))

LUGGAGE

- One large kit bag (preferably a rucksack or a bag with soft sides – Please do not bring hard suitcases as they are very difficult to pack in our trailers and can pose a problem for any light aircraft flights you may take as part of your safari. Semi-hard suitcases should be avoided as well.
- One item of hand luggage (e.g., a small backpack) – there will be room for this at your feet
- Main luggage: max weight = 18kg, max. size = 700mm x 350mm x 350mm
- Remember that on safari you need far fewer clothes than you think so bear this in mind when packing

PERSONAL EQUIPMENT

- Torch with spare batteries and bulbs – a head torch is a good idea
- Hat/cap
- Scarf and gloves (especially for winter months)

- Warm jacket/fleece/jumper – windproof in winter months (May - Sept), waterproof in summer months (Nov - Mar)
- Swimming costume
- Natural clothing (i.e., no bright colours and no white), t-shirts, shorts, a pair of light weight long trousers and a lightweight long sleeve shirt (long sleeves are extremely useful for sun protection during the day and mosquito protection during the evening)
- Please note that camouflage printed clothing is fine for the bush but please do not to wear in towns or when crossing borders.
- Comfortable walking shoes and flip flops/sandals
- Camera equipment, binoculars, lots of spare films, batteries and spare memory cards for digital cameras are essential as the opportunity to download photos is limited.
- Adaptors for cables, chargers, USB, etc.: note that we recommend you label them to avoid confusion on the vehicle charging station
- Water bottle and a small daypack for walks TOILETRIES AND FIRST AID
- Personal toiletries and medications in small bag, not a vanity case
- Sunscreen
- Malaria prophylaxis (see section 5 for further information)
- Mosquito repellents/ lotion/ spray
- Toilet paper (this is only necessary if you prefer 2 or 3 ply toilet paper)
- Waterproof/zip lock bags for storing personal items to keep dust free and/or dry.
- Personal First Aid Kit Please note: A First Aid Kit will be present throughout the safari, but personal medicines must be brought for the duration of the safari.
